'Murundak - songs of freedom' is a new film which documents the amazing and powerful story of Aboriginal protest music.

'Murundak' means 'alive' in the Woirurrung language, of the Kulin Clans of Victoria.

The film follows the Black Arm Band, which includes such well known artists as Archie Roach, the late Ruby Hunter, Dan Sultan, Emma Donovan, Ursula Yovich and Rachael Maza Long, from the Sydney Opera House to the UK and into remote Aboriginal communities many of whom are suffering under the Northern Territory Intervention. Their songs are of sorrow, anger, resistance and hope as they expose, through music, the past and continuing impact of colonisation on their people.

In addition to the inspirational performances, we hear about the impact that the tour had, not only on their audiences, but also on the members of the band.
